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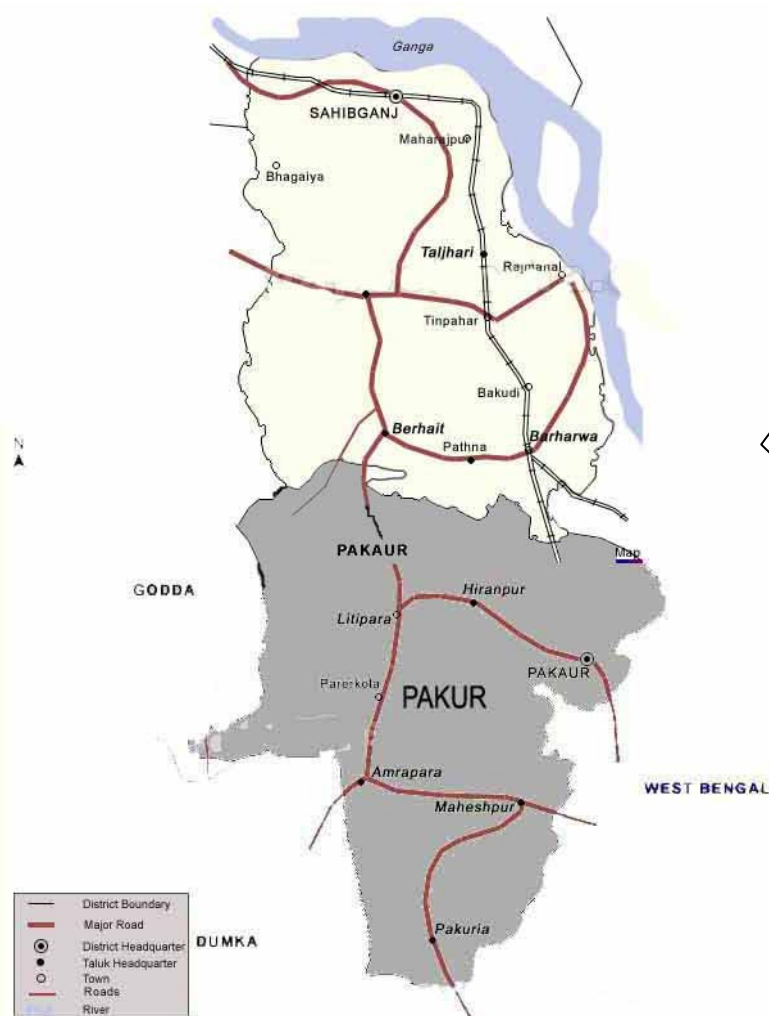

Jan lok kalyan parishad devised eco friendly, right-based, socially and economically viable strategies which results in sustainable development of village community. We focus on providing livelihood support through their capacity building. People's priority for livelihood generation will shift from short term benefits to long term developmental activities. This will inculcate the habits to start entrepreneurial activities which will ultimately raise their standard of living. Thus, we emphasize on livelihood development support and community mobilization which can bring forward empowerment and development of village level institutions. Our observation and experience during work, conceived that we are strengthening capacity to our front line field level staffs and in these process strengthening villages with more focus on SHGs as village level primary institution. We also believe that three tier governance and decentralization is the only way out for effective development. I feel extremely honored to express my gratitude to all the partners in our effort towards development, especially CBOs, Government Departments, Donors, Partner NGOs, media and colleagues who have provided their support which resulted in bringing positive changes in all the working sectors of our organization.

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JLKP works in the District of Pakur and Sahibganj with an extensive working and focus in all the six block of Pakur namely- Pakur, Hiranpur, Littipara, Amarapara, Maheshpur, and Pakuria. The idea behind selecting these blocks was that the people in the operational villages lived a very low standard of living. The Villages are dominated by ST and SC population, and are lagging behind from the mainstream of development



Brief Background

Twenty one years back in 1989, two energetic young men named Sri Binod Kumar Parmanik and Shiv Charan Uraw from a very small village of Makhani in Sahibganj District, formed a club in the name of Nehru Yuva Club. The motive of this club was to guide the youths of tribal and pahariya Villages, those are living below poverty line, for their rights and obligations. The club got registered in year 1990. The villagers were cooperated the club most for expanding its activities and projects in health and education. In the year 1992, Sri Subhash Sharma, then was hon'ble district collector of Sahebganj, was much impressed by the social activities of the club and encouraged the club members for registration. The club was registered Under Society Registration Act 1860 in the name of "Jan Lok Kalyan Parisad". Onwards the organization got lots of opportunities by the district administrations, CBOs, funding agencies and govt. Secretary of "SRI" Ranchi, Dr. A.K. Basu selected our organization as a best society in Pakur for year 2001. From that period, Jan Lok Kalyan Parisad never looked back and active in changing the lives of people securing livelihood of rural and tribal Pooors.

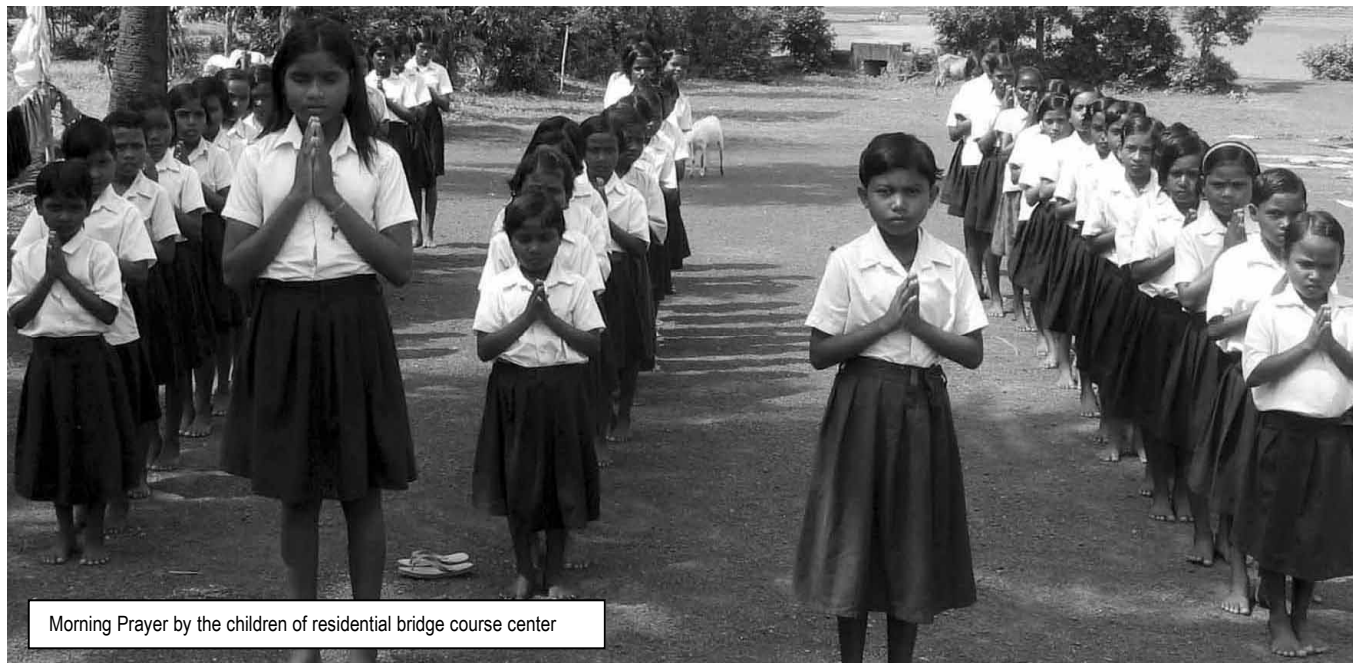

Project – Residential & Non Residential bridge course education center



The education facilities have not been able to percolate with the required intensity in the rural areas of Pakur District. In this backdrop JLKP tried to make tribal and poor rural children to enroll in formal and non formal Schools so that they can complete their elementary cycle of education. We have been able to take School to the community and community to the School. JLKP started with an experimental innovation Residential and Non residential bridge course center in Chapadanga village in pakur block with support from Jharkhand Education Project, Pakur to strengthen the education system in these areas.

Funding partner – Jharkhand Education Project Council, Ranchi

Operational areas – Pakur and Littipara Block of Pakur district

Goals and objectives – The main objective of this project is to educate these children comes under the age group between 9-14 years those are belongs to ST/SC/Pahariya category and are dropouts and not going to any formal or non formal schools, So that they can get primary education and can be mainstreamed to a formal educational center to complete their elementary cycle of education.

Activities conducted during project period–

- Meeting with Block level officials
- Meeting with village heads at block level.
- Exposure visit of concerned Government officials, JEP, village heads.
- Survey, identification and mapping of target children in the entire Pakur block,
- Village wise enrolment drive of children for RBC.
- Capacity building of Camp warden, teachers and all the related staffs.

Achievements in 2009-10

Jan Lok Kalyan Parishad is running 2 Residential Camp Schools and 9 Non residential camp schools. In this year 100 numbers of children are enrolled in residential bridge course center and nearly 180 numbers of children in non residential bridge course center running by our organization. These children will be mainstreamed to the formal education center near by their villages.

The organization has its own practical difficulties and for the teachers the work is very demanding indeed. But the end-results, enabling those underprivileged children to get admitted to the formal schools makes it all worth while. The camp helps the children to get matured also. The children make extraordinary progress in their academic fields as well as in the whole growing up process, becoming noticeably self-confident.

One of the major objectives of the organization is to facilitates assess to education for women of pakur district who contributes a major part in determining a very low literacy rate of this district. Illiteracy in tribal women is one of the major hindrances in social and economic development of these areas. The main objective behind the condense course for women is to instilling confidence among adult women and strengthen them socially and economically through education which subsequently makes them efficient in their livelihood promotional activities.

Funding partner – CSWB, Central social welfare board

Operational areas – Two Villages namely Sangrampur and Tibhitha of Pakur block.

Activities conducted during project period–

- Survey and mapping of Villages.
- Survey and identification of target women age groups between 15 – 35 years, in the target areas
- Recruitment of staffs and volunteers.
- Jan lok kalyan parishad employed two part time staff and one full time instructor for this project in two villages of Pakur block.
- Capacity building of staffs, teachers, instructor and volunteers.

Achievements in 2009-10

This year 25 numbers of women were benefited by JLKP's intervention in Sangrampur and Tibhitha villages of Pakur block. These women were selected for condense course those were enthusiastic in learning to improve their educational backwardness. 25 numbers such enthusiastic and extremely poor women were completed their course in this center, who are now able to read and write and can express themselves in languages whatever they wish. It also improved self confident among adult women.

Operational areas –

Goals and objectives – JLKP's one of the missions is to enable the rural poor and vulnerable masses for effective and optimum utilization of natural resources available in their locality. Due to lack of modern technical know how the villagers' living standard remains unchanged in spite of rich natural resources.

Achievements in 2009-2010

A dramatic increase in production capacity of land has been observed by implementation of SRI techniques. The farmers who were yielding 6 (mun) = 3 quintals paddy from 1 (one) Bigha land by practicing traditional method of farming, now they are growing 12 to 16 quintals paddy from the same piece of land.

Activities conducted during project period–

- Survey and mapping of Villages.
- Survey and identification of 5 (five) farmers from each villages in Littipara block.
- Selection of land.
- Analysis of growing cost of rice in old methods.
- Meetings with farmers and village's heads.
- Training through SRI techniques.
- Support for hybrid seeds and better fertilizers.
- Practical implementation of these techniques by farmers.



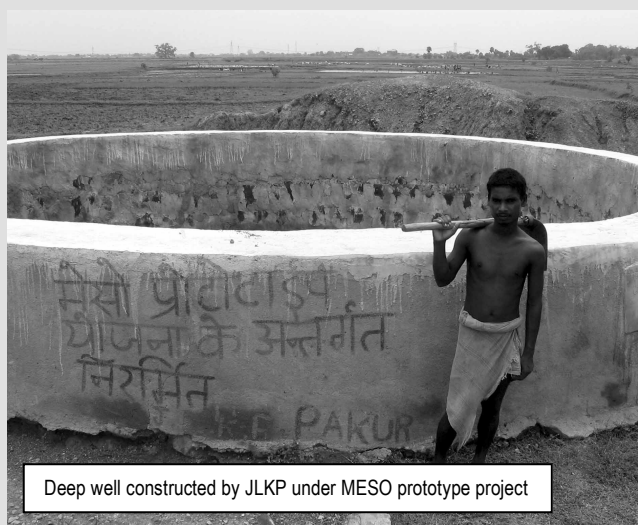

Achievements in 2009-2010

- Three numbers of lift irrigation systems are installed.
- Five numbers of deep wells is constructed.
- Land leveling is done in four places.

Funding partner – MESO, Pakur.

Operational areas – Within three villages of Pakur Block of Pakur district.

Goals and objectives – The goal of this programme is to empower the local community, to promote sustainable improvement for livelihood security and to improve general quality of life of the tribal and other poor families.

Activities conducted during project period– The programme activities would be centered on the development of micro- watershed in tribal villages of Pakur district. This was focus because most of the land in the programme area has been severely degraded, so an early priority would be to stop further damage due to shortfall of rain water.

- Providing the concerned communities with the means of local decision making and planning, in order to ensure that the activities are responsive to the tribal needs and perception.
- Making communities more responsible for the management of their development in order to generate a greater sense of ownership of development interventions.
- Building the traditional and indigenous wisdom, knowledge, capacities and values of the community.

Activity – Goat rearing

Funding partner – MESO, Pakur

Operational areas – 40 (Fourty) remote and backward villages of Pakur District is selected.

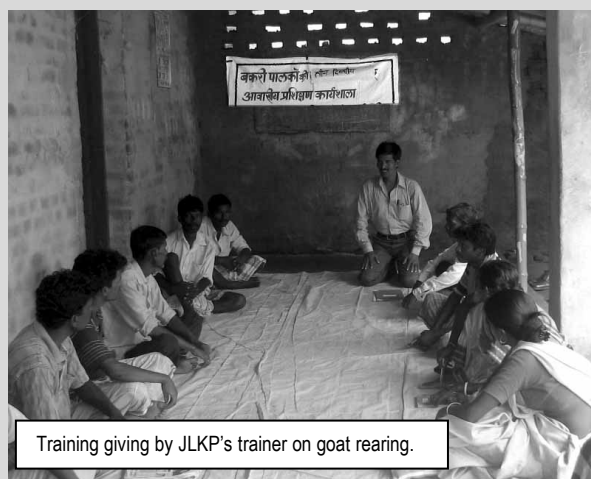
Goals and objectives – The goal of this programme is to empower the local community, to promote sustainable improvement for livelihood security and to improve general quality of life of the tribal and other poor families in most backward villages of Pakur district.

Activities conducted during project period–

- Selection and mapping of most backward tribal and pahariya villages of Pakur district
- Identification of 6 (Six) families from each of the selected villages.
- Facilitating and distribution of goats
- Monitoring, Capacity building and providing training

Achievements in 2009-10

In this financial year 2009-10, 4+ 1 = 5 goats were distributed to 12 farmers (i.e 5 goats to each farmer) in two villages of Littipara block. This year a total of 24 farmers are benefiting by JLKP's intervention in this areas. The beneficiaries are now earning additional income of RS 1000 to 1400 per months.

Project - Village resource center

Funding partner – ISRO

This is an ongoing project of JLKP. This satellite based project, VRC, aims for digital connectivity to remote villages for providing multiple services such as tele-education and remote sensing applications through a single window. Unless we take the benefits of science and technology to the villages, we cannot get rid of poverty, ignorance and diseases. The setting up of VRC in littipara block is yet another saga of adventure that has been taken up by Jan lok klyan parishad to benefit the rural and tribal people of this area. It proved as an important tool to address the changes and critical needs of rural communities. The VRC is a totally interactive VSAT based network. The information provided will be in the form of geo-referenced land record, natural resources, suitable sites for drinking water as well as sites for recharging to replenish ground water, water harvesting, rural employment creation, watershed, environment, infrastructure, alternate cropping pattern, and so on. In addition, VRCs will facilitate access to spatial information on important subjects like land use/land cover, soil and ground water prospects which can enable the farmers to get support in taking important decisions based on their query. Thus, ISRO-VRC project strives to promote a need based single window delivery system for providing services in the areas of education, health, nutrition, environment, agriculture and livelihoods to the rural population to empower them to face challenges.

Operational areas – Littipara block of Pakur district.

Organizing the poor women and men of villages into a Self Help Group is a powerful tool for bringing social transformation and livelihood promotions. The concept of Self Help group is based on participatory involvement of both women and men from the equal economic status and same locality for sustainable community development and brings social changes in their villages. This not only improves their economic status but also develop their capacity to organize themselves to deal with the emerging socio-political issues which affect their day to day life.

Funding partner – District Rural Development Authority, Pakur

Operational areas – In seven panchayats of littipara block. Namely Taljhari, Baadu, Litipara, Nabardhee, Ghaghari and Jaamjori.

Activities conducted during project period–

- Meeting with block level officials
- Meeting with villages heads and gram panchayats
- Survey, identification of men/ women & mapping of villages.
- Mobilizing the underprivileged, deprived poor men and women into a Self help group
- Capacity building and training
- Linking them to local Banks
- Assisting them in micro financing through bank according to grading
- Keep tracking of satisfactory operation of self help group's business activities.

Achievements in 2009-2010

In this year Jan lok kalyan parishad played a key role in the development of Micro Enterprises in the various villages of Littipara Block of Pakur District. JLKP has a strength of 85 nos. of women SHGs, out of which 25 nos. of women SHGs were formed in this financial year and successfully linked to the local banks. New groups are in the process of formation. A total of 1020 numbers of rural women of Littipara block of Pakur district were benefited by this program.

Project – Total sanitation campaign

Funding partner – PHED, Pakur, PHED Sahebganj
Operational areas – In 7 (Seven) Panchayats of Sahebganj district, namely Barhet, Boreo, Udhawa, Rajmahal, Barharwa, and in 1 (one) Panchayat of Pakur block, namely Jikarhatti.

Goals and objectives – Improving sanitation is the key to achieving our health related millennium development goals of reducing child mortality and combating disease. The practice of open defecation by the majority of poor rural household is one of the most serious environmental threats to public health. Open defecation and failure to confine excreta safely are prime factors that contribute to the spread of disease and infection through the bacteriological contamination of water sources and the transmission of pathogens through the fecal oral route. Due to ignorance and unhygienic behavior of tribals these subsidized toilets remains unused or are being used for purposes other than sanitation. Most of people continue to defecate in the open not due to lack of access to toilets but primary because they see no reason to change their behavior because awareness of associated health risk is limited or ignored. Public health outcomes can be achieved only when the entire community adopts sanitation behaviour for 100% open defecation free zone. Jan lok kalyan parishad implemented TSC, a people centered participatory and demand driven approach, which is being implemented in a campaign mode. This new paradigm is a shift from allocation based and supply driven program to a demand driven programme; from a top down to participatory approach, and it tries to generate a campaign to highlight issues related to sanitation by involving all stakeholders. This impose that strong emphasis is placed on information, education and communication and social marketing, which will increase people's awareness in terms of enhancing capacity to choose appropriate options.

Achievements in 2009-2010

Jan lok kalyan parishad has constructed about 9000 low-cost latrine structures for the beneficiaries of operation villages. i.e 8000 in Sahebganj district and nearly 1000 numbers of such latrines in Jikarhatti panchayat of Pakur block.

Behavioral change is being noticed among the villagers. Beneficiaries are using these toilets in a regular basis and they are also motivating the others for the same. Through this program, we also selected Village level health volunteers who will be the key health worker for the village and will take care of the health needs of the villagers, starting from counseling women on reproductive issues, awareness of safe water for health, The volunteer also generate mass awareness about preventive health issues. For this purpose, the Organization is taking care of their capacity building in various preventive health aspects.

Project – Rajiv Gandhi National crèche scheme for the children of working mother



With increased opportunities for employment for women and the need to supplement household income more and more women are entering the job market. With the breaking up of joint family system and the increased phenomenon of nuclear families, working women need support in terms of quality, substitute, and care for their young children while they are at work. There has, however, been very slow growth of Crèche/ Daycare facilities, resulting in failure to meet the needs of working mothers in terms of extent, content and quality of services. Crèche and Daycare Services are not only required by working mothers but also women belonging to poor families, who require support and relief from childcare as they struggle to cope with burden of activities, within and outside the home.

Funding partner – JSWB

Operational areas – Binjha Village of Littipara Block.

Goals and objectives – The goal of this programme is to empower the local community, to promote sustainable improvement for livelihood security and to improve general quality of life of the tribal and other poor families in most backward villages of Pakur district.

Achievements in 2009-10

Twenty five numbers of tribal poor families of Littipara block were benefited each year by this ongoing programme of our organization.

The beneficiaries' families and working mothers are getting support and relief from childcare when they go for works.

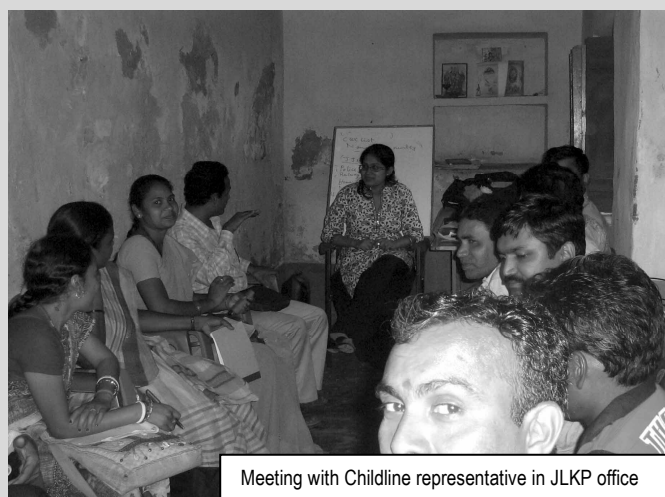
Project – Family counseling center



JLKP successfully running the family counseling center at Pakur city. The motive behind the Family counseling center is to resolve conflicts in the family by Counseling, referral and rehabilitative services to women victims who are in moral danger within the family or society at large including those affected by disputes, marital discord or maladjustment. This services is provided free of charge. The Family Counseling Centre work in close collaboration with local authorities e.g. police and institutions like Short Stay Homes and intervene in 'crisis' cases and in cases of atrocities against women. The organization has appointed two counsellors (one male & one female) for providing best service to the victims. The programme is appreciated by the many officers and social activist in district of Pakur.

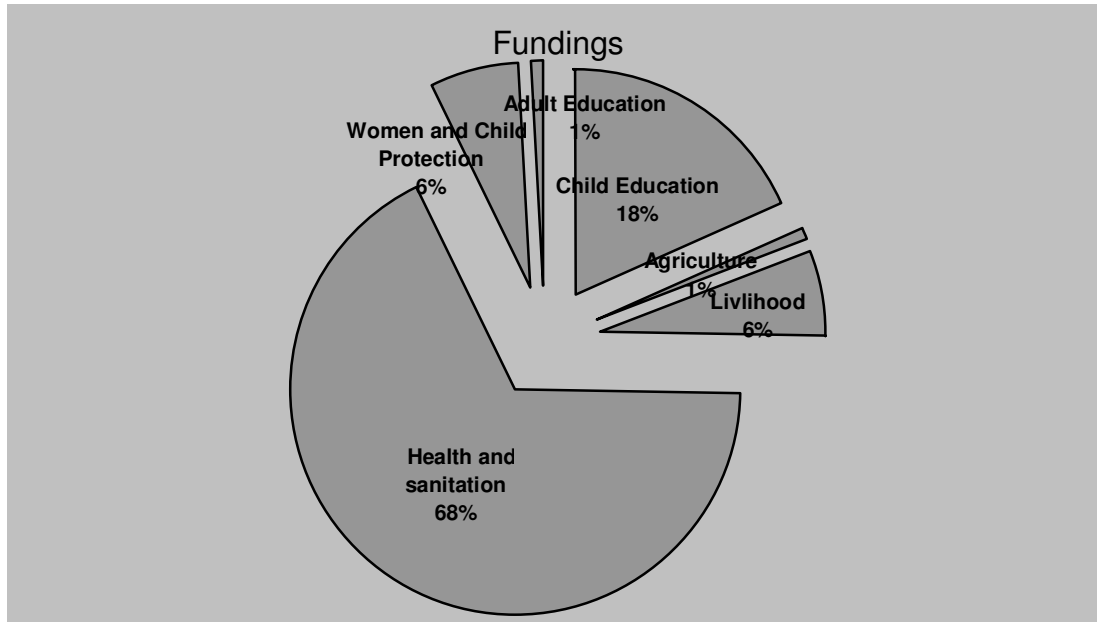
Project - Child helpline service

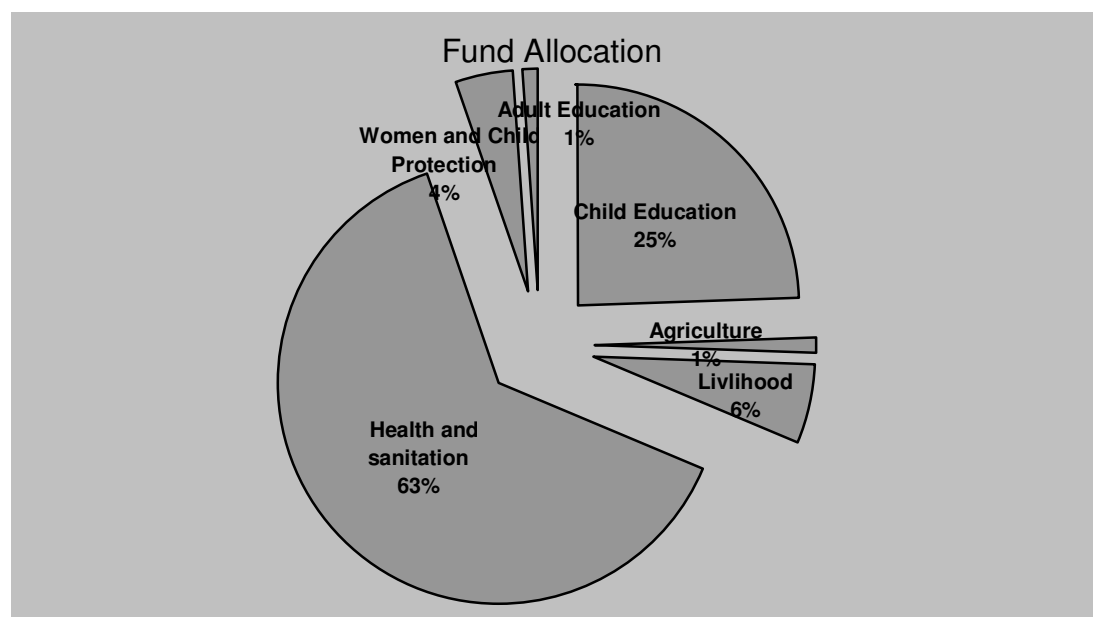


Meeting with Childline representative in JLKP office
